As a graduate of the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program at Thomas Edison State University (TESU), you will have the skills and knowledge necessary to move to director and executive level positions in an organization — helping to advance and transform healthcare. Depending on what works best for you, you can enroll in one or two 3-credit courses each term. To receive your degree in 18 months, you will enroll in two 3-credit courses each term for six consecutive terms. If you prefer to complete your program over 36 months, you will enroll in one 3-credit course each term.

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CAREER INSIGHTS

- ▶ The top 33 percent of nurse leaders (includes directors and managers, likely holding advanced degrees like the DNP) earned more than \$170,000¹
- ► The top 22 percent earned between \$200,000 and \$249,999¹
- The top 10 percent earned more than \$250,000¹
- ▶ 81 percent of CNOs/CNEs, 91 percent of system CNOs/ CNEs, 53 percent of consultants, and 91 percent of presidents/ vice-presidents all earn **more than \$150,000** annually. About 71 percent of all directors earn between **\$100,000** and **\$169,999.**¹
- The average salary for DNP nurses was \$113,347, or nearly \$8,000 more than the average salary for nurses with a master's degree.²
- ▶ Average salaries for nurse practitioners in New Jersey that earned within the top 25 percent (75th percentile) and the top 10 percent (90th percentile included \$130,630 and \$158,300 respectively.³
